How To Discern The Will of God In Everyday Decisions

- I. Obedience To The Written Will of God Is A Prerequisite To Know His Will.
 - a. If we are not willing to obey the obvious will of God why would He reveal anything else to us?
 - i. We must agree to do God's will before He will reveal anything to us.
 - **b. Act 9:6**, "Lord, what wilt thou have me to do?"
 - i. God's will is not a menu from which we can choose whatever fits our will.
 - c. Jesus said, "I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly" (John 10:10).
 - d. Trusting the Lord is a prerequisite to knowing His will.
 - i. Psalm 7:1,"O LORD my God, in thee do I put my trust."
- 2. Though we may not find a specific verse or passage of Scripture that fits our life situation, we can find a specific Biblical principle that will help us determine God's will for today.
 - Psalm 119:105, "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path."
 - **James 1:5**, "If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him."
- 3. We Should Seek Godly counsel that God has put in our life.
 - **Proverbs II:14** "Where no counsel is, the people fall."
 - **Proverbs 1:5** "a man of understanding shall attain unto wise counsels."
- 4. God has promised to put His desires in the heart of the person who delights in Him.
 - Psalm 37:4 "Delight thyself also in the LORD; and he shall give thee the desires of thine heart."
- 5. Direction from The Holy Spirit.
 - John 16:13 "Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth..."
 - Romans 8:16 "The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit..."
- 6. Confirmation from the Trinity.
 - a. Three Green Lights!
 - **I.God The Father...**The providence of God.
 - 2. God The Son... "The Word."
 - 3. God The Holy Spirit... "Guide you into all truth."
 - **a.** The Holy Spirit is always in total harmony with the Word of God.
