The Greek word translated angel in the verse above is aggelos. It has been translated "messenger" seven times and refers to a messenger sent from God. God has given pastors in local churches to be messengers from God to Christians. Christians without pastors are like children without parents.

#### **Establishing The Office of The Pastor**

The command given in Titus 1:5 is to "Ordain (Translated "make ruler" 6x) elders (Pastors) in every city, as I had appointed thee." We read in Acts 15:41 that Paul and Silas, "Went through Syria and Cilicia, confirming the churches."

# Behaviour In The Local Churches First Timothy 3:14,15,



Two years ago, I set out on an in depth study to attempt to determine what is acceptable unto the Lord concerning church membership. The first thing that was necessary was I needed to be sure I was interested in proving what is acceptable unto the Lord, rather than what is acceptable to my friends in the ministry.

# "Set In Order The Things That Are Wanting"

There are seven verses in the Bible that contain the phrase "set in order." Four of them are found in the Old Testament and have to do with how God wanted things done in the Old Testament worship services. The phrase appears twice in the New Testament and both have to do with how the Lord wants things done in our local churches.

The Corinthian church was operating in a manner that was not acceptable with the Lord and Paul wrote them a very rebuking letter concerning what they needed to straighten out and said, "And the rest will I set in order when I come" (First Corinthians 11:34).

Paul also wrote to Titus saying, "For this cause left I thee in Crete, that thou shouldest set in order the things that are wanting" (Titus 1:5).

### **God's Purpose For The Local Church**

Is it God's purpose for the local church to be a place to win souls or a place to strengthen Christians? According to Paul God gave pastors for...

#### **Ephesians 4:12-15**,

The perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, (2)) for the edifying of the body of Christ: Till we all (3) come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ: ((4) That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive; But speaking the truth in love, (5) may grow up into him in all things, which is the head, even Christ."

We should take advantage of every opportunity to win people to the Lord. I have had the privilege of winning people to the Lord after many church services over the years; however, the purpose given for the church in the verses above is plain. The people are to be trained to do the work of the ministry.

The purpose of the church service is to perfect the saints and edify the Christian. The purpose the Christian remains in this world is to bear fruit for the Lord.

In **Second Timothy 2:2,** the pastor is commanded to teach,

"...faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also."

#### Matthew 28:19,20,


(I) "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, (2) baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: (3)

According to the verse above we are to "go" and reach people for Christ. They are to be baptized, and we are to teach them "to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you."

It was very likely they would lose their job and they also risked death, either at the hand of Paul, before he was saved, or at the hand of Nero.

# **Things Have Changed!**

Two-thousand years ago when someone was baptized, publicly professing their faith in Christ, they were willing to put their lives on the line. They were willing to **die** for the Lord. We don't have that situation today; however, no one should be considered as a member of the Lord's local church today, who is not willing to **live** for Him.

At FairHavens Baptist Church we require all members to be faithful to the services of the church. Potential members are taught that they have the same responsibility to the church that the pastor has. If the pastor misses a service to watch some sports activity on television or to go and visit family, the people should find a new pastor. If a church

member skips church for something like that the church member should be instructed to get in line or find a church that allows a cheap membership.

Obviously, there are going to be times when the pastor or people will be away; however, if the church, that Christ "purchased with his own blood" is no more than an add-on in life, it is an insult to the Lord.

#### At Fair Havens Baptist Church members are required to be loyal to the pastor and to one another.

That does not mean they will never disagree. It means they will disagree scripturally. It means if they have a problem they will "Go and tell him his fault between thee and him alone" (Matthew 18:15).

Those who are guilty of "sowing discord among the brethren" should be subject to church discipline.
