Discernment

The dictionary defines discernment as "the ability to judge things," and it defines it in a Christian context as "obtaining spiritual direction and understanding." Notice it includes "direction." The main reason to understand something is to know what course of action we should take.

First Thessalonians 5:21 says,

"Prove all things; hold fast that which is good."

The word prove in this verse has been translated **discern** twice. **Luke 12:56 Jesus said,**

"Ye hypocrites, ye can **discern** the face of the sky and of the earth; but how is it that ye do not **discern** this time?"

Jesus sharply rebuked them because they were not able to figure out what course of action needed to be taken at that time. We are commanded to discern "all things" concerning what course of action we are to take during the time in which we live.

Christ spent three years dealing with His disciples about the urgency of discerning what is right and what is wrong so that they might take the right course of action.

The word know in this verse has been translated "understand" eight times.

The Urgent Need For Discernment In The Last Days

Second Timothy 3:1,

"**This know** also, that in the last days perilous times shall come."

Discernment Is Not Optional For Christians

It is critical that we discern the will of God in these days of apostasy or we will be discouraged which will lead to compromise.

If parents do not discern between right and wrong their family will suffer the consequences. If pastors do not discern the right path to take in our day of apostasy churches will be destroyed.

Why Are Christian Leaders Going In Different Directions?

It is unlikely that any Christian parent or any sincere Christian leader sets a goal to compromise; however, compromise is inevitable to everyone who does not learn to discern. That is why Christ focused on the importance of His leaders understanding.

Consider the following verses. Matthew 15:10,

"Hear, and understand."

Matthew 15:17,

"Do not ye yet understand?"

Matthew 16:9,

"Do ye not yet understand?"

Matthew 16:11,

"How is it that ye do not understand?"

Matthew 24:15,

"Whoso readeth, let him understand."

Mark 7:14,

"Hearken unto me every one of you, and understand."

Mark 8:17,

"Perceive ye not yet, neither understand?"

Mark 8:21,

"How is it that ye do not understand?"

Mark 13:14,

"Let him that readeth understand."

Luke 24:45,

"That they might understand."

John 8:44,

"Why do ye not understand?"

That is why Paul, the apostle focused on the importance of understanding.

Romans 1:13,

"Now I would not have you ignorant."

Romans II:25,

"For I would not, brethren, that ye should be ignorant."

I Corinthians 10:1,

"I would not that ye should be ignorant."

I Corinthians 12:1,

"I would not have you ignorant."

I Corinthians 14:38,

"But if any man be ignorant, let him be ignorant."

2 Corinthians 1:8,

'For we would not, brethren, have you ignorant."

2 Corinthians 2:11,

"Satan... ignorant of his devices."

I Thessalonians 4:13,

"I would not have you to be ignorant, brethren."

Discernment Is Conditional

Discernment does not come by reading commentaries or articles like the one you are reading now. Discernment comes only through the Word of God.

The Doorway To Discernment (V.9, "Then shalt thou understand")

Proverbs 2:1-12

- I My son, if thou wilt receive my words, and hide my commandments with thee;
- 2 So that thou incline thine ear unto wisdom, and apply thine heart to understanding;
- 3 Yea, if thou criest after knowledge, and liftest up thy voice for understanding;
- 4 If thou **seekest** her as silver, and searchest for her as for hid treasures;
- 5 Then shalt thou understand the fear of the LORD, and find the knowledge of God.
- 6 For the LORD giveth wisdom: out of his mouth cometh **knowledge and understanding**.
- 7 He layeth up sound wisdom for the righteous: he is a buckler to them that walk uprightly.
- 8 He keepeth the paths of judgment, and preserveth the way of his saints.
- 9 **Then shalt thou understand** righteousness, and judgment, and equity; yea, every good path.
- 10 When wisdom entereth into thine heart, and **knowledge** is pleasant unto thy soul;
- 11 Discretion shall preserve thee, understanding shall keep thee:
- 12 To deliver thee from the way of the evil man, from the man that speaketh froward things;

For many years, to my shame, I would rely on what my heroes said in a sermon or a commentary on a subject. If Scofield said it, I believed it. If M.R. DeHaan said it I believed it.

Then one day I decided to put my commentaries away and study the Scriptures. I had studied the Book of Acts extensively for many years; however, in recent years I have put over 400 hours into studying the Book of Acts again, this time without any commentaries. I have concluded that what the commentaries say and what the Word of God says does not always line up.

Warning! Do not believe anything in the article you are reading now until you check the Scriptures! "Searched the scriptures" to see if these things are so. Never get direction from an article like the one you're reading. I might be wrong! Discernment comes from the Word of God not from the word of anyone who writes books or articles.

II He answered and said unto them, **Because** it is given unto you to know the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven, but to them it is not given.

12 For whosoever hath, to him shall be given, and he shall have more abundance: but whosoever hath not, from him shall be taken away even that he hath.

13 Therefore speak I to them in parables: **because** they seeing see not; and hearing they hear not, neither do they understand.

We Need To Understand That Separation Is Not Isolation

Matthew 28:19-20 says,

"Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, **even unto the end of the world**. Amen."

We Need To Understand That Spiritual Discernment Is Critical

A Christian without spiritual discernment in this age in which we live will become discouraged and discouragement can lead to compromise. Compromise is inevitable for the one who cannot discern, "the difference between the holy and profane," or "discern between the unclean and the clean" (Ezekiel 22:26).

How Do I Learn To Discern?

I. We Must Realize That We Have Two Natures.

The old nature, referred to as the "natural man" wants control.

First Corinthians 2:14,15,

"But the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned. But he that is spiritual judgeth all things, yet he himself is judged of no man."

Spiritual discernment is spiritual, therefore, the "natural man" or our old nature, "receiveth not the things of the Spirit." Paul was writing to Christians. The phrase "natural man" is not only referring to unsaved people, it refers to the old nature in all Christians. Paul was talking to Christians in Corinth who were under the control of their old nature.

First Corinthians 3:1,

"I, brethren, could not speak unto you as unto spiritual, but as unto carnal, even as unto babes in Christ."

First Corinthians 2:14.


Paul continued, "he that is spiritual judgeth all things."

First Corinthians 6:5,

"I speak to your shame. Is it so, that there is not a wise man among you? no, not one that shall be able to judge."


2. <u>We Must Realize That Discernment Is Conditional</u>. <u>Romans 12:1,2</u>,

"I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, **that ye may prove** (Trans. "discern" twice.) what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God."











Luke 12:56,

Jesus rebuked those who could, "...discern the face of the sky and of the earth; but how is it that ye do not discern this time?" He continued, "Yea, and why even of yourselves judge ye not what is right?"

Once Again, It Is A Choice Christians Must Make. Proverbs 2:1-5 says "If"

- 1. "My son, if thou wilt receive my words,
- 2. and hide my commandments with thee;
- So that thou incline thine ear unto wisdom, and apply thine heart to understanding;
- 4. **If** thou criest after knowledge, and liftest up thy voice for understanding;
- 5. **If** thou seekest her as silver, and searchest for her as for hid treasures;
- 6. **Then** shalt thou understand the fear of the LORD, and find **the knowledge** of God."

Proverbs 2:6 continues,

"For the LORD giveth wisdom: out of his mouth cometh knowledge and understanding."

3. We Must Realize That Discernment Is Available For All Christians. However; It Is A Choice!

Hebrews 5:14,

"But strong meat belongeth to them that are of full age, even those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil."

The Greek word translated "excercise" is gymnazo. It is where we get our word gymnasium. If we are in the Word we have our senses "exercised to discern both good and evil."

<u>Second Peter 2:1</u> warns us of the other choice. <u>Verse 14</u>,

"They have exercised with covetous practices."

The Greek word translated "covetous practices" is pleonexia. It means to "desire to have more" (Strong's Concordance). It is a constant danger for pastors to sacrifice the truth of the Word of God because he has a desire to have more people.
