- Colossians 4:17 says, "Take heed to the ministry which thou hast received in the Lord, that thou fulfil it."

Every Christian has a ministry to fulfill.


The Local Church Ministry

We have been influenced by our environment that numbers means success. While this may be so at a ball game, it certainly is not so concerning the local church.

Ninety-nine percent of our churches are small churches. Only one percent of the people who attend church next Sunday will be in a large church. A recent survey released by the Barna Research Group of Venture California, reported that the average church attendance in the USA five years ago was ninety people. His survey revealed that black churches put the average up, as they averaged one hundred people while white congregations averaged eighty five. He reported that in the U.S.A, fundamental churches averaged about seventy-five people on any given Sunday. Obviously, fundamental churches in Canada would average far less than those in the U.S.A.

In spite of this fact, the focus is always on the one percent of large churches. If the survey is accurate, it means as God looks down on our world next Sunday, He will see ninety-nine percent of the people attending a church in Canada will be in a small church. It has been my experience as I travelled this country from coast to coast for many years, that our churches are maintained by small groups of sincere Christians who must sacrifice to pay their pastor's salary and keep the church going.

These faithful Christians do not have the financial resources larger churches have, however, unlike most large churches the same faithful people return for the evening service and the weekly prayer meetings. God does not consider these churches to be failures.

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Smaller churches have less available leadership to help and therefore have a much more difficult time attracting people, however, according to the Barna Group report, small or mid-sized churches have the largest number of "born again believers."

God Has Some Large Congregations The Psalmist said in Psalm 42:4,

"I had gone with the multitude, I went with them to the house of God, with the voice of joy and praise, with a multitude that kept holy day."

First Corinthians 3:7 says

God, "giveth the increase."

Sometimes God increases the size of the church, however, the majority of God's congregations are small.

In Psalm 119:141 the psalmist said,

"I am small and despised: yet do not I forget thy precepts."

It is good to have a multitude in church if the increase is of God, however, an increase that is acquired and maintained by compromise is not a successful church.

Proverbs 15:16 says,

"Better is little with the fear of the LORD then great treasure and trouble therewith."

Proverbs 16:8 says.

"Better is a little with righteousness than great revenues without right."

A church that has hundreds of people sitting in a building getting their weekly fix of religion while remaining spiritual pygmies is not a successful church in God's eyes.

God wants people who are capable of, "Holding fast the faithful word as he hath been taught, that he may be able by sound doctrine both to exhort and to convince the gainsayers" (Titus 1:9).

The one pastor of the seven churches listed in the Book of Revelation that received no rebuke from the Saviour, was the pastor at Philadelphia. The Lord highly commended him.

Christ said in Revelation 3:8,

"I know thy works: behold, I have set before thee an open door, and no man can shut it: for thou hast a little strength, and hast kept my word, and hast not denied my name."

The pastor of the church that received the sharpest rebuke was the church of the Laodiceans.

Revelation 3:17 says that church was "rich and increased." They had a crowd but where was Christ? He said, "Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with

"Does the place you're called to labor Seem too small and little known? It is great if God is in it, And He'll not forget His own.


