
But, Do We Honestly Want The Truth?

Exposing Peter

"Before Them All..."
(Galatians 2:14)



Why Did Paul Confront Peter Publicly?

In Galatians 2:11 - we have previously read that when Peter was leading people astray and even "Barnabas also was carried away with their dissimulation" that Paul rebuked Peter "before them all" (Galatians 2:13,14).

People Naming People

There are just under 3000 individuals named in the Word of God. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, people wrote about people. The Book of Hebrews includes the names of Abel, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Sarah, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, Rahab, Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, Samuel and David. God not only had a man give us their names, He also had him reveal their manner of living.

God Commanded People To Expose People Who Went Contrary To His Word

God Had Someone Expose...

- Noah for getting drunk.
- Abraham for lying.
- **Jacob** for scheming.
- Samson for being a womanizer.
- **David** for adultery and murder.
- Rahab for being a harlot.

In First and Second Timothy, Paul named over twenty people who were involved in the work of the

Lord. Most of them were named in a positive way; however, some of them were mentioned in a very negative manner because they were living contrary to how God commanded them to live.

Paul exposed...

- **Hymenaeus** for causing problems.
- Alexander for causing problems.
- **Demas** for quitting.
- **Phygellus** for causing problems.
- **Hermogenes** for causing problems.
- Those who had, "cast off their first faith."
- Those who were, "speaking things they ought not."

In First Timothy 6:5 Paul commanded the Christians saying, "from such withdraw thyself." How would church members at Ephesus follow this command if they did not know who they were to "withdraw" from, and how will Christians know today?

It was not a pleasant duty for Paul to expose Peter publicly; however it had to be done. Peter was Paul's very good friend. When Paul was first saved and couldn't find a friend who would trust him Peter befriended him. In Galatians 1:18 Paul said, "I went up to Jerusalem to see Peter, and abode with him fifteen days."

Friend or not, Peter had to be exposed "before them all." He was a well known Christian leader with a very public ministry. He was causing "Barnabas" and "other Jews" to be led astray. Galatians 1:13 says, "And the other Jews dissembled likewise with him; insomuch that Barnabas also was carried away with their dissimulation." The word dissimulation has been translated "hypocrisy" five times.

Peter had changed his position. Verse twelve says, "For before that certain came from James, he did eat with the Gentiles: but when they were come, he withdrew and separated himself, fearing them which were of the circumcision." The same Peter who without fear drew his sword in the garden of Gethsemane was now "fearing" what some of his friends would think.

Again, it was not a pleasant duty for Paul to expose Peter publicly; however it had to be done. The command is clear. First Timothy 5:20 says, "Them that sin rebuke before all, that others also may fear." It is never a pleasant duty to openly expose those who are promoting that which "is contrary to sound doctrine;" however, we are commanded to rebuke them "before all." Our so-called fundamental movement is plagued with leaders who have changed their positions in recent days. If they are not exposed for their hypocrisy we will lose our young people. Remember, silence always gives consent.
